

ORDER EXTENDING TIME FOR FILING ANSWER OR OTHER PLEADING

It appearing to the Court that this action was instituted on the 25th day of October, 1949, the same being an action against the President of the University of North Carolina, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina, and other officials of said institution, and,

It further appearing to the Court that it is necessary for counsel for the defendants to confer with the defendants and that counsel for the defendants, the same being the Attorney General of North Carolina and his staff, due to pressure of business and other pending litigation, desire extra time in which to file answer or other pleading and desire extra time for conference with clients, and counsel for plaintiffs having been notified of this situation and it being agreeable that extra time for filing answer or other pleading shall be granted by the Court:

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED BY THE COURT that the defendants, and each of them, be, and the same are, hereby granted a period of thirty (30) days from and after the expiration date of the regular time for filing answer in this cause, that is, the defendants, and each of them, are hereby allowed up to and including the 16th day of December, 1949, in which to file answer or other

pleading in this cause.
